Upon applying to the Family, you will have your standard assessed in detail by IFOAM - Organics International experts against the COROS (Common Objectives and Requirements of Organic Standards), an international norm approved by IFOAM - Organics International, FAO and UNCTAD. This assessment will enable you to see potential areas of improvement and serves as an input for possible standard revision.

The IFOAM Family of standards acts as THE global directory of organic standards. It is prominently displayed at the IFOAM - Organics International booth at all major trade fairs (e.g. BioFach), conferences and events, and on the IFOAM - Organics International website. As soon as you apply to the Family, your standard will be listed (initially as an applicant) in the Family Frame.

The IFOAM Family of Standards is the most powerful tool through which IFOAM - Organics International promotes harmonization (whenever possible) and the improvement of all organic standards globally. The COROS has become the most important international reference norm for evaluating organic standards. The assessment process of the Family of Standards will enable you to grasp exactly how the COROS tool works in its approach and in its details. This will increase your ability to influence the future development of the COROS norm. It is also an indispensable step if you aim to use the COROS yourself in the future to assess other standards or for other purposes.


This is the core function of the Family of Standards. It contains all standards officially endorsed as equivalent to the COROS (and therefore as truly organic) by IFOAM - Organics International. This is the international credibility criteria for organic standards. You can communicate this official approval to your clients, partners, authorities, etc. through the use of a specific logo which comes with the approval.

Is your standard stricter than average? Is your standard especially innovative in particular areas? The assessment against the COROS will reveal these strengths and, with your consent, the conclusions of the assessment will be published through the Family Frame. This will give other stakeholders in the organic movement, as well as interested buyers, consumers and journalists, a quick and independent overview of the added value of your standard.

ACCESS OTHER OGS SERVICES THAT ARE CONTINGENT UPON FAMILY APPROVAL. the IFOAM Family of Standards is the centerpiece of the new IFOAM Organic Guarantee System (OGS). This means that to access other services of the OGS, such as accreditation, you first need to have your standard approved in the Family.

Certain countries already recognize the Family of Standards as a basis for equivalence of foreign standards. This means, once your standard is approved in the Family, it is automatically approved as equivalent by these countries and your clients can get market access using your standard. IFOAM - Organics International is negotiating with further countries, and in the future this approach will become increasingly widespread. The Family of Standards promotes the concept that one standard is enough to access several markets. Reputable organic fairs and other private programs are also increasingly looking at certification against a Family-approved standard as a criterion for product acceptance. Who can apply

All organic standards that can be used for certification or other forms of verification are eligible to apply for the IFOAM Family of Standards, if they are final (not draft) documents that can be made public. Approval depends on the results of an equivalence assessment using the COROS.

All organic owners that are currently developing or revising organic standards or regulations can also request assistance from IFOAM - Organics International on how to bring their standard in line with the COROS. This is a separate service (not part of the formal IFOAM Family application process).

How to apply

If you are a private standard owner, download the Family of Standards application form from the IFOAM - Organics International website (www.ifoam.bio/ogs). Submit a completed application form, along with an English, French or Spanish version of your standard, to ogs@ifoam.bio. The Family of Standards is a service subject to fees (for private standards). If you would like a government regulation to be considered for the IFOAM Family of Standards, please contact us directly.
